

**Primary School's Sports Funding**

**Churchill Gardens Primary Academy 2014-2015**

**What is the Sports Premium funding?**

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

Churchill Gardens Primary Academy will receive £9,210 in the school year 2014/2015.

Our intention is to target this funding in areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE, and school sport for all pupils.

**Churchill Gardens Primary Academy uses the Sports funding to:**

- **Extend after-school sports activities.** The funding has allowed Future Academies to set up 'Saturday Sport' which is a sports club run throughout the day on Saturdays at Pimlico Academy, offering six different sports for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 pupils.  
**Estimated spending:** £6,560
- **Improve swimming provision.** This means children in Year 3 will have access to quality swimming instruction on a regular basis. This should help to ensure that by the time children finish year 6 they can confidently swim 25 metres.  
**Estimated spending on additional swimming:** £950
- **Increase the skill level of staff in the delivery of quality P.E. teaching, by paying for release time.** Staff will be released from class teaching to work alongside specialist sports coaches in other Future Academies Schools in order to receive training in the different sports we are teaching. We will also purchase new curriculum guidance to support teaching and learning.  
**Estimated spending:** £600
- **Provide sports clubs in the school holidays.** Organised and led by Pimlico Academy's specialist sports staff, pupils in Years 5&6 will be offered sports clubs during the term breaks. Our pupils will receive high quality coaching in a range of different sports over a period of two days.  
**Estimated spending:** £1,100
- **Provide opportunities for children to compete.** We feel it is important that children have the chance to represent their school and take part in competitive sport against other schools. The sports leader from Future Academies, Primary, will organise competitions and tournaments.  
**Estimated spending:** £350
